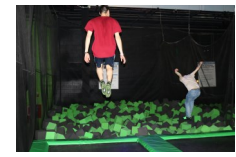
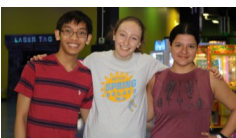


Harvard University Health Services:
